The aim of the project is to create teaching modules for pupils in the field of health literacy. The project is supported by the Erasmus + program under the name of KA220-SCH Cooperation partnerships in school education.

PHILIP PROJECT SHEDS LIGHT ON PUPILS LEVEL OF FAMILIARITY WITH HEALTH INFORMATION

The first result of Philip's project is an analysis of health literacy among pupils (11-15 years) from partners' countries. The analysis is based on interviews with professionals in the education and health field and conducted questionnaires to 276 pupils.

The main findings are that pupils' level of familiarity with health information is rather low and they show little interest in the importance of learning more about their own health. But on the other hand, the professionals in education and health recognized that the impact of COVID-19 has increased the focus on health issues not only among adults but children too.

The main problem for children is differentiating true from false information when they surf the Internet. Taking into account this situation, there are several challenges they have to face. Our next steps are focused on these challenges.

NEXT STEPS

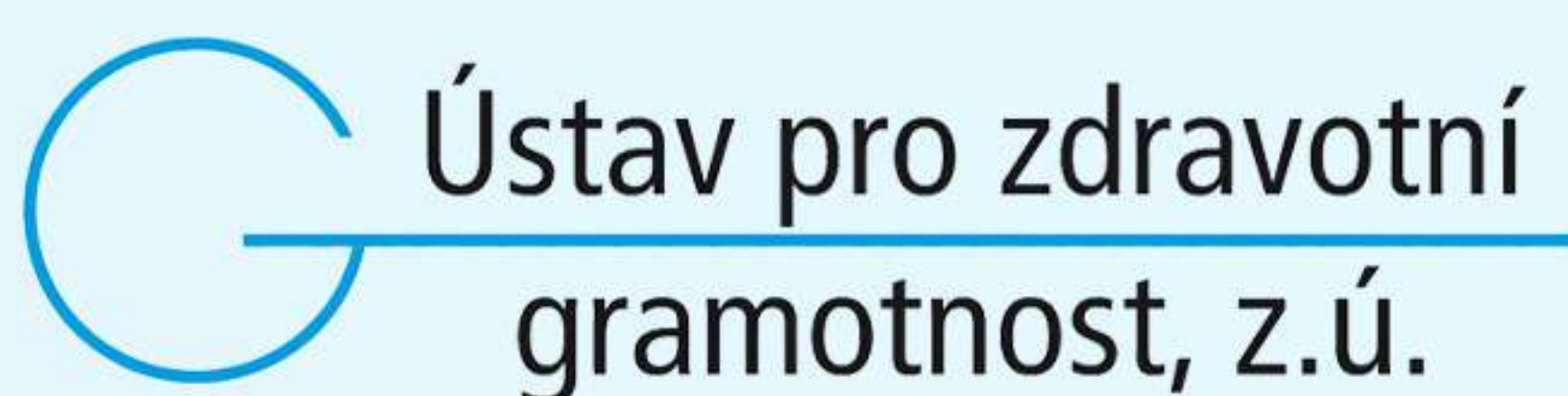
